**From the web;**

August, the eighth month of the Gregorian calendar, is named after the Roman Emperor Augustus Caesar. Originally, it was the sixth month in the Roman calendar and known as Sextilis. The Roman Senate renamed it in 8 BC to honor Augustus, who chose this month due to several of his military victories. The month has 31 days, matching the length of July, which was named after Julius Caesar.

**August 3, 1492** - Christopher Columbus Set Sail with three ships, the Nina, the Pinta, and the Santa Maria

***Here are a few historical facts in August.***

**6th August, 1881** - Sir Alexander Fleming was born in Scotland. Fleming would become the pharmacologist and Nobel Prize winning-physician who discovered penicillin.

**6th August, 1945** - The United States became the first and only nation to use atomic weaponry during wartime when it dropped an atomic bomb on the Japanese city of Hiroshima. Three days later, another was dropped on Nagasaki. Japan announced its surrender a few days after.

**8th August, 1963** - Britain's Great Train Robbery – arguably the most famous heist in British history – in which £2.6m was stolen from Royal Mail took place.

**9th August, 48 BC** - In the Battle of Pharsalus near central Greece, Julius Caesar defeated Pompey the Great.

**9th August, 1483** - The Sistine Chapel in the Vatican, Rome, was opened. The ceiling of the Sistine Chapel later became one of the Italian artist Michelangelo's finest works, as well as one of the most significant artistic accomplishments in human history. Michelangelo painted the chapel's ceiling between 1508 and 1512 under the patronage of Pope Julius II.

**13th August, 1961** - Known as 'The Hardest Day of the Second World War', this was the day during The Battle of Britain that saw the highest losses of aircraft on both sides. One hundred and thirty-six British and 100 German aircraft are thought to have been damaged or destroyed.

**22nd August, 565** - According to biographers, the Loch Ness monster was said to be spotted for the first time by St. Columba while he was on his way to visit the king of the northern Picts, near Inverness.

**28th August, 1833** - After years of campaigning and suffering, the Slavery Abolition Act was given Royal Assent in Britain. Slavery was abolished in the majority of British colonies and around 800,000 slaves in the Caribbean – as well

**31st August, 1997** - Diana, Princess of Wales, died in a car crash in a road tunnel in Paris.

### Happy Summer Residents of Village 1!

#### Dogs

Personally, it's always nice to see so many residents out walking their dogs. However, I do not like to see how people dispose of their dog's waste in a lot of cases...if they do clean it up at all. There are public garbage cans located around the Village, people should not be utilizing the in-ground personal garbage cans as they seem fit. The Maintenance Department should not have to receive and address calls regarding stray dog waste bags in their garbage cans. Please take your bags back to your unit to dispose of it properly.

Leaving your dog(s) outside, unattended is not permitted. Additionally, you are required to clean up any dog waste around your property. Too often there are literal mine fields around the buildings which is considered common ground and the Maintenance Department, residents or guests should not have to be concerned while walking through these areas.

#### Your dog(s) must be leashed at all times.

If you are observed not cleaning up after your dog, improperly disposing of waste bags, un-leashed dog(s) or allowing your dog(s) to roam around outside unattended, you can expect a letter and potential fines from the Board of Trustees.

#### Air Conditioning

Easiest way to battle the heat is to stay inside and enjoy your air conditioning! Maintaining your air conditioning is the responsibility of the residents. Basic service of your air conditioning does not require permission request forms and is recommended to keep your units running efficiently. Window units are not permitted anywhere in Village 1, that includes in the windows or through the walls which is a common thing we see around the Village. These window air conditioning units have slots which are vented out the sides and the top of the unit, which will create issues in the wall cavities. Besides the vented heat, there is a chance the condensation can back up and cause

structural issues to the building. If you have an improperly sized unit in the larger cut outs on the sides of the building, stuffing it full of stuff to stop drafts is not a good idea. When your unit eventually comes up for sale and an inspection is completed, you should be prepared to pay for removal and replacement of the existing under-sized, wrong style air conditioning units...as well as, any associated damage from the improper wall units. Central air conditioning units are to have their associated condensation lines to deposit on the exterior of the buildings and not in the crawlspaces. If this is discovered at your unit, you will be required to correct the condensation and to pay for any cleanup of residual liquid or damage resulting from this improper installation.

Portable (floor) air conditioning units are acceptable, as long as they are properly vented to the exterior of the building.

Contact the Maintenance Department if you are considering swapping an existing air conditioning unit or are looking to install a new one and we can certainly point in the direction of having a proper unit installed properly.

#### Grills

Doing some outdoor grilling goes hand in hand with the summer time. It is important that you keep the grills a minimum of 10 feet from the buildings. If you are a propane user, Village 1 does not want to see spare propane cans (empty or full) around the exterior of the buildings. Charcoal grills are not permitted.

If you need extra storage, Village 1 does allow residents to purchase a shed for extra storage. There are regulations to the size and shape of the sheds, please contact the Maintenance Department for information.

## HOPA Deadline: Friday, August 29, 2025

**Failure to comply by the deadline will result in a \$50 fine.**

Completion of the HOPA form is **state-mandated** and required **every two years**.

If you've already submitted the form for 2025, **no further action is needed**.

If you have not yet done so, please complete the form on the next page and return it to the office. The next HOPA submission will be required in **2027**.

### **MANCHESTER COORDINATING COUNCIL**

The MCC monthly meeting was held on Monday, June 23, 2025  
at Village 5 Clubhouse, Schoolhouse Rd, Whiting, NJ.

Mayor Joseph Hankins addressed this year's taxes. Typically, one-third of taxes will go up, one-third will go down, and one-third will remain the same. Sample studies conducted indicate that this trend is continuing this year. Mayor Hankins enjoys visiting our communities. To schedule a visit, call Judy Noonan at 732-657-8121 ext. 3108.

JCP&L will be adding a 20% charge for BPU starting after November.

Sgt. Robert Sharry, Emergency Management Coordinator of the Manchester Township Police, was introduced. A recent change to the Uniform Fire Code now requires that any commercial structure, rental property, or quad units and larger must comply with the updated code.

Mulch, which is dried chopped wood, must be removed from within 18 inches of houses. For rental properties, landlords are responsible for making this change. Non-combustible materials should be used instead of mulch. The township wants all residents to be aware of this important safety enforcement.

Since Co-ops own the buildings, it's advised that they consult their attorney to determine who is responsible for complying with this code update. Manchester Township is responsible for overall enforcement.

Chris from Flock Safety (585-489-4282, [flocksafety.com](http://flocksafety.com)) gave a presentation on public safety cameras. The system offers license plate recognition and connects to the NCIC (National Crime Information Center) database. The cost is \$5,000 for two cameras. MCC participants agreed it would be beneficial to install cameras at the entrances to Whiting. It would also be valuable to have them on our county and state roads to enhance safety within our community.

## HOPA Survey (Housing for Older People Act)

It requires that periodically information must be collected and verified with the age of all residents. If a survey is not completed, the senior housing community could lose its housing status.

It is mandatory that this survey be completed and filed with the Co-Op office.
