Saint Patrick was a 5th-century Romano-British Christian missionary and Bishop in Ireland. Much of what is known about Saint Patrick comes from the Declaration, which was allegedly written by Patrick himself. According to the Declaration, at the age of sixteen, he was kidnapped by Irish raiders and taken as a slave to Ireland. It says that he spent six years there working as a shepherd and that during this time, he found God. The Declaration says that God told Patrick to flee to the coast, where a ship would be waiting to take him home. After making his way home, Patrick went on to become a priest.

According to tradition, Patrick returned to Ireland to convert the pagan Irish to Christianity. The Declaration says that he spent many years in Northern Ireland and converted thousands

Patrick's efforts eventually became an allegory in which he drove "snakes," heathen practices, out of Ireland despite the fact that actual snakes were not known to inhabit the region.

Tradition holds that he died on 17 March and was buried at Downpatrick. In Ireland, St. Patrick's Day is a public holiday.

Saint Patrick's Day celebrations have been criticized, particularly for their association with public drunkenness and disorderly conduct. Some argue that the festivities have strayed from their original purpose of honoring Saint Patrick and Irish heritage.

So many holidays and celebrations that I've written about are based on religious beliefs. I never thought Valentine's Day was created on religious beliefs, and yet three saints were beheaded because of their actions against the Roman Empire.

MINUTE

Hello Residents of Crestwood Village 1,

Happy Winter or is it Spring? I can't tell anymore!

Total Work Orders (past 30 work days) = 242

There is a lot of work being completed in the Village that **IS NOT** following the procedures set forth in the Rules and Regulations governing Crestwood Village 1 Co-op. These procedures are not something new and have been long standing policies. All residents are required to submit a Permission Request Form to the Trustees Office for just about anything you are considering doing in your unit. The buildings you reside in are the Co-op's and they are required to be notified when any alterations are being made. These Permission Request Forms are usually in your monthly newsletter, but can always be found on the website at crestwoodvillage1.com under the Village Forms tab.

Trying to police this is a nearly impossible thing to do, as not only do we have contractors with properly labeled vehicles, but we have your "neighborhood handyman", a friend or a friend of a friend and then of course we have our own residents who take things upon themselves. We understand repairs can be expensive, but the cost can potentially be much greater if you have to go back and correct any shoddy workmanship. I have seen girders and floor joists cut partially out or a three foot section being removed because all of a sudden there is a need to add or relocate plumbing, portions of knee walls in the attic removed to accept central air conditioning, cut throughs our vinyl and/or brick siding, satellite dishes on brand new roofs or the installation of solar tubes…and the list goes on. The Co-op has the authority to have the resident revert any unauthorized work back to its original condition.

These non-permitted activities, when we are lucky to catch them in the act, can and will be shut down on the spot. NO EXCEPTIONS! If you elect to bypass the Village's policies, then we are within our rights to do so. You will then be responsible for either reverting the work back or be inconvenienced as you wait to submit a Permission Request form, receive approval and then try and get back on your subcontractors schedule. If you have followed the correct protocol and your requested work is approved, you will receive a placard that is to be posted in your window to signify your approval. If no placard is posted, then you can expect your job to be shut down.

All these non-permitted activities ultimately cost the Village a lot of money to correct. Often times, it can be years down the road before issues arise or if we randomly come across issues doing crawlspace inspections due to complaints from residents. This is money that could be better utilized to perform actual Maintenance of our buildings and Village, rather than it going towards correcting these potentially very serious issues which could've been avoided by simply following the expected protocol.

The Rules and Regulations of Crestwood Village Co-op, Inc. (provided at closing, by request or available on-line) discusses these items more thoroughly. If you do reference your Rules and Regulations, under Unit Upgrades on page 3, items 21a., 21b., 21c., 25b., and 26 you will see more information. Basically, anyone doing anything should reach out to the Maintenance Department or the Trustees Office to discuss your specific situation. Permits may also be required through Manchester Township depending on your request and are expected to be completed.

I cannot stress enough that the Rules and Regulations are there for a reason and every resident of the Crestwood Village 1 Co-op must adhere to them.



Send a copy of this letter with your forms, it will serve as proof. The PTR form must be signed by the Administrative Office staff.

Brian McDonald and Brian Corvinus from the State of NJ Dept of Environmental Protection NJ Forest Fire Service started in Manchester in 1906. They are fully responsible for wildfires in the woods, thats their jurisdiction. They work in conjunction with the local firefighters who are responsible for fires in houses out of the woods. 1500 wildfires state-wide, average 7000 acres burn at any given time. Burning cycles, they try to strive for the 7-year mark. 3-5 years for urban areas to be burned in specific locations. Ticks are active year-round. In the winter, they burrow in the ground more, but they are still out there.



Senior Security Matters:

Scams For All

With Income Tax season upon us, we are once again seeing an uptick of several financial scams and related issues targeting Seniors. There have been reports of individuals peeking into mail boxes, possibly hoping to find a refund check inside.

We are also receiving various online scams arriving via social media mail and on cell phones.

Beware of fraudulent PayPal, Technical Assistance, and EZ Pass messages. They claim that you owe money, or need to update your software or credit card information. The goal is to get you to click on the included link, and provide requested financial information which they plan to use to hack into your banking information.

The key is: **DO NOT CLICK ONTO ANY LINK**. If you desire to check any of these accounts, go to the web site independently, and check your status.

There are also outside dangers lurking about. Many of us have been bothered by so-called energy providers, whose goal is to change your account to their service. They have no permission to solicit in the village.

Car thieves have a new scheme, where they put some type of paper on your back window while your car is parked. They wait for the person to start the car, then get out of the car to remove the paper, hopefully while the car is running, at which time they hop in and steal the car.
