Celebrants wear masks and costumes for parties and trick-or-treating, which is thought to have derived from the British practice of allowing the poor to beg for food, called "soul cakes." Trick-or-treaters go from house to house, threatening to pull a trick if they do not receive a treat, usually candy.

When I lived in upstate New York, it would often snow on Halloween, but the kids would still come to the door for treats. It is a special time of the year.





ANCHOR REBATE

The deadline to apply is November 30, 2024. A Treasury spokesperson said benefits will begin to be distributed on October 1 to auto-enrolled residents, and most new applicants can expect to receive their payment "within 90 days of applying."

Officials said the ANCHOR program paid more than \$2 billion last year, when more than 1.8 million residents got a refund for the 2020 tax year. Homeowners can receive up to a \$1,500 refund and renters can get up to \$450 – with eligible seniors 65 and older getting an extra \$250.

Eligibility and payments for this year's program are based on residency, income, and age for the 2021 tax year. Homeowners must have had an annual gross income of \$250,000 or less, and renters must have had an annual income of \$150,000 or less that year to be eligible.

ANCHOR replaced the state's Homestead Benefit relief program.

SENIOR FREEZE

(Property Tax Reimbursement)

2023 payments are currently being issued to qualified applicants.

The Senior Freeze Program reimburses eligible senior citizens and disabled persons for property tax or mobile home park site fee increases on their principal residence (main home). To qualify, you must meet all the eligibility requirements for each year from the base year through the application year.

2023 Applications

We mailed Senior Freeze applications on February 12, 2024. First-time filers or those who must reestablish a base year may <u>print the PTR-1 application and/or instructions</u> or file online.

The deadline for 2023 application is October 31, 2024.

Happy Fall to the Residents of Village 1!

Well, it didn't take long for the leaves to change and start falling. This month I would like to discuss some items regarding the changing seasons and what you can do to help prepare yourself for the cooler months ahead. As most of us already know, we can get some heavy winds ripping through the Village which can and probably will cause damage in one way or another...hopefully this article will help you to prepare. If there is any damage from something of yours hitting into another person's property (Co-op included) you will be financially responsible for any related damages.

Lawn Décor

It's about that time to start breaking down your Summertime related décor and furniture. Please pull in any lawn furniture you have out, either on a patios or on the lawns. Close and store any umbrellas, remove canopy/gazebo covers and any seasonal items should be removed. Crestwood Village 1 respectfully requests that these items be stored in garages, sheds or porches for safekeeping. If you cannot store items in any of these locations, then please NEATLY store them against your unit, in a location that will not be a potential eyesore for the next 6 months. Just a reminder, there should be no gasoline cans or propane tanks left around your building.

Brush and Bag Procedure

Every Thursday, the Village 1 Co-op provides removal of brush and bags for our residents. Please take advantage of this awesome service. There are several guidelines for you to follow to make this as efficient as possible, especially when considering the 1,016 individual units that are present here in Village 1.

The Village 1 Co-op requests that on-street parking be limited on Thursday's brush and bag pickups. Especially down in the courts, people tend to "spread out", making it very difficult for our large grass truck to make it through sometimes. If there are excessive vehicles on the streets or down the courts at the time of service and the workers deem the situation hazardous, they have been directed to go pass the street or court and will not make a return trip until the following Thursday. If the situation continues, the Village 1 Co-op will revisit the on-street parking policy here in Village 1.





- Brush and bags must be out the night before or by no later than 6:30 AM the morning of Thursday's pickup;
- Raking and/or blowing the leaves to the curbs is NOT PERMITTED and will not be picked up the Co-op;
- There will be no return trips or doubling back for calls regarding missed pickups or late callers. There are 5 workers on the trucks doing the pickups and is highly unlikely that we are missing any piles or bags;
- Typically, there are 2 vehicles making the rounds, 1 for brush and 1 for bags;
- Brown paper recyclable lawn and leaf bags are the only types of bags permitted to be picked up and used for yard clean ups;
- These bags are for leaves, pine needles, acorns and pine cones;
- The workers will leave your bags if there is evidence of improper materials stored; sticks, planters, excessive soil, rocks, etc. and if it is too heavy. The intended materials are not heavy and should not make the bags heavy enough where the workers struggle to get them in the truck;
- These rules are promulgated by Manchester Township and they can revoke our dumping privileges if they are not abided to;
- Brush is to be left in neat piles by the curbside, on the lawn;
- The brush will be picked up and chipped up as we make our way;
- Root balls will not be picked up and arrangements will have to be made for separate pickups;
- Excessively large piles of brush may not be picked up. If it appears that the brush piles were left by a subcontractor, a call will be placed to the resident, as it is pretty obvious when this occurs.

MANCHESTER COORDINATING COUNCIL

The MCC monthly meeting was held on September 23, 2024, at Village 5 Clubhouse, Schoolhouse Rd, Whiting, NJ.

Manchester Chief of Police Antonio Ellis was introduced. He brings extensive law enforcement and investigative experience to Manchester. He explained various road and traffic pattern projects currently being worked on that will benefit safety.

Police Captain Vega was introduced. A participant asked for suggestions on how to carry through on safety due to speeding in the village roads. Title 395A1 is what governs private property. Our police department will work with any association; we can request assistance, and they will allow usage of their equipment. The data gathered can be shared with the community that is being monitored, showing the residents that they need to improve their driving habits. The officer states you lock your doors, don't leave valuables visible in your car, and don't leave yourself open to opportunity. The cost has significantly decreased if you were interested in getting a surveillance or ring doorbell. A participant asked if there were any problems since the High Profile Dispensary legal marijuana store opened in Lakehurst. Driving while ingesting marijuana slows your reflexes. You will get pulled over if driving with signs of DUI. Officers do and are encouraged to drive through communities to show their presence.

A participant asked if we have enough staff and personnel to handle the two new large housing developments that are being built. The Presidential is ready to be completed. There will be a lot to address to handle this influx. They have a plan to increase man and woman power. The other project by Commonwealth requires a complete re-construction of Commonwealth Blvd.

There are challenges coming up. We want to keep our community as rural as possible. Manchester is diverse and constantly growing.

Karen presented information regarding how we can protect the trees that are in existence now. Application to remove a tree, according to inches on the graph provided, is \$225 plus \$400 engineering review; if you don't replace a tree, you have to put money in a tree save fund, which will be \$100 for trees removed. Karen has a letter to Manchester Twp leadership urging the township to remove these fees. Our homeowners should not incur the high cost of removing a dead tree. Developers are exempt, which is not fair. We have to take care of our tree canopy. What comes down should be replaced. Trees do not have to be replaced in the same place they are removed. The council has not decided to vote on this ordinance.

Electric meter updates show a change in monthly costs. Some are seeing their charges double, and some have seen no change.

October 28, 2024, is our next MCC meeting. The guest speaker is the Board of Education.


