** A number of Trustees have concerns involving the items listed below from our Rules and Regulations. It's not just a matter of ignoring rules, it's a safety issue.

This has to stop. Letters will be sent and fines will be issued.

Rules and Regulations (1st. page)

- 3. Speed limit in the Village is twenty (20) miles per hour. All **STOP** signs at intersections **MUST** be observed.
- 6. Cars must be parked head-on in unit parking areas to eliminate the possibility of exhaust fumes entering the apartments. No repair or maintenance of any type of motorized vehicles is allowed to take place in the parking area, street or any other place in the Village.
- 7. Each Quad member holder is entitled to a parking space. Vehicles parked in tandem in parking spaces must not extend beyond this designated parking space. When space is unoccupied it is still reserved for his or her use and shall not be used by another resident, guest or visitor, unless permission has been given IN WRITING to do so. This is very important to eliminate any misunderstanding. No resident can give any other resident permission to use a guest spot as GUEST SPOTS ARE FOR VISITORS IN THAT BUILDING ONLY. You may park legally on the street while following Rule #1. If you have visitors, please advise them that if they have parked in a space other than those designated for GUESTS AT YOUR BUILDING, they must move their car to parking on the street OR you will be fined.





Hi Everyone! I just want to give an update on some of the happenings in the Village. With the upcoming elections, we are being asked about political signs. Our rules read **Political signs may be up for a limited time.** A maximum of one (1) sign only may be displayed per unit. It must not exceed 18" X 24", must be within 6' of building, cannot obstruct sidewalks, may be displayed ten (10) days prior to election date and must be removed the day after the election. We do encourage everyone to show their Patriotism and hang out their American Flags. Imagine how beautiful it would be with all those American Flags swaying in the breeze! We ARE on schedule with our **power washing!** We have budgeted for this year (every 3 years) to power wash all buildings. This is scheduled to begin in **mid September**. Happy September Residents of Village 1!

Total Work Orders Closed (past 30 days) = 246

I would love to say that Phase 1 of the road sealcoating project went off without a hitch, but we did pretty well considering the magnitude of the project. Phase 1 is complete, with some minor repairs that will be needed. We definitely learned as we went along here and will make sure Phase 2, currently scheduled for 2025 in the area of Columbine Avenue, Laurel Drive and Aster Place, will go much smoother.

So as we are coming back up for air, we are looking to start our next project. Happy you asked what that might be. That is the Village wide power washing of the buildings. We don't have an exact schedule as to when this will commence, but we anticipate somewhere towards the end of September or early October. We are weighing out options as to the most efficient way to accomplish this task, either with the use of a supplied water tanker truck or to go building by building to find a generous resident to provide water usage to power wash the entire building that they live in. So you might get to see my smiling face at your door asking you about water usage.

The power washing is dedicated to the buildings only and is not for sidewalks, patios, driveways or three (3) season rooms. We are focused on the white vinyl siding. We will send out plenty of advance notice with either mailings, hand delivered notices or robo-calls...maybe some combination of the 3. Please have your windows shut and any belongings that you have stored along your unit (which you probably shouldn't be storing along your unit, another topic for another Maintenance Minute) moved away so the workers from Thompson Power Washing can completed their assignments to the best of their ability. Please don't approach the workers for additional work for favors, they will not accept and besides that, you are putting yourself in harm's way between the high powered water, the hoses everywhere and the fact they might not see you or hear you coming. Again, notice will be supplied as soon as a schedule is set.

On the topic of placing robo-calls to residents, we are realizing that there are A LOT of phone number no longer in service. Either residents commenting on they are not receiving these robo-calls, inability of either of the offices to contact residents with the phone numbers that we have or residents leaving messages with phone numbers that are not in our system. Please reach out to either the Trustees Office or the Maintenance Office to update this crucial information.

Another topic that the residents should strongly consider is providing the Maintenance Department with a copy of your keys. This can save time and issues with emergency personnel needing to make entry, the inevitable "I locked myself out of the house" or allowing the Maintenance Department to access the unit in case of emergency if you are travelling or just not around. The Maintenance Department will never make entry without prior arrangements and the permission of the certificate holder, unless there was an emergency such as water running out of the front door of the building.




