Manchester Township Emergency Management Coordinator will be at the Open / Reps meeting on January 25, 2018. Plan to attend. There are facts you should be aware of such as the clubhouse is only a "warming station". We cannot provide facilities such as sleeping, bathing, etc.

Bus Riders: Conduct on the bus provided by the Co-op is controlled by the carrier. The bus is a service provided to members of this village and is entirely dependent upon your actions when using this service. Should any trouble arise the driver has the right to prevent anyone from using the bus temporarily or permanently.

Common ground area between buildings. Yes, its common ground but as you care for that area around your house so does your neighbor around his. Don't let your dog use his area for what should be confined to, your own area. **THEN PICK UP!!!** That's the right thing to do.

The Board of Trustees has received a request from a couple of residents that the common grounds be cleaned up. Please know that the common areas are kept in their natural state. We do not cut, trim or remove trees from these areas. In some common areas such as along Route 530 where passing traffic throws debris out of cars, we will clean up, such trash.

Delinquent Members of Co-Op. Please remember...You must be current with your payments in order to use the facilities of the Clubhouse and golf course.

Cars must be parked head-on in parking areas to eliminate the possibility of exhaust fumes entering the homes. See Rule #8 of Rules and Regulations.

Its dark early this time of year...When walking your pet, wear light colored clothing and carry a flashlight. Get noticed!!

If you've got a toilet that still drips or runs after flushing, don't ignore it. A resident just paid \$632.00 not realizing how much water can be lost.

Remove outside hoses before they freeze!!!

Please observe speed limit in the village. 20MPH

Mark Your Calendar

Garbage Collection Each Monday and Thursday.

Except New Years week will be Tuesday and Friday.

Do not place Garbage OUTSIDE of container

until the MORNING of collection.

Recyclables Friday, December 8th, and 22nd.

Put recyclables out the NIGHT before pick-up.

Please put recyclables in containers, not plastic bags as it cannot be readily identified as garbage or recyclables. ONLY "button cell" and rechargeable batteries are

recyclable. All other batteries go into regular garbage.

Village Light – Bulk Pick-Up December 27th. Last Wednesday of every month. Includes all electronics – MUST BE OUT BY 7:00 AM!!! NOTE: Bulk pick-up is for oversize items – NOT entire house clean-up. We will pick up special clean-ups, but only by special arrangement with the Maintenance Dept.

Yard Debris

Every Thursday. Remember leaves, needles and pine cones ONLY!!! CANNOT be picked up in plastic bags. The refuse center will not let us dump plastic bags. It MUST be in BIO-DEGRADABLE PAPER BAGS ONLY. Available at maintenance dept. or local stores.

Every Thursday. At the curb.

Doing some work around the house...

The State of New Jersey Uniform Construction Code Regulations is the rules that govern when and if permits are required. The following are some examples but should not be considered an all inclusive list.

Permits are required if:

- You cut away a wall or any portion thereof
- You cut any structural beam or bearing support
- Construct an addition or make alterations to your home
 i.e. enclosing a porch or patio cover
- Installing, replacing or re-locating a hot water heater
- Installing, replacing or re-locating any water drainage or venting
- Installing of heating or air conditioning systems
- Installation or upgrading any electrical wiring or plumbing

Permits are not necessary, but permission from the Co-op is if:

- You add or replace shutters, awnings or railings
- Installation of Solar tubes
- Installation of Satellite Dish (TV)
- Window replacements
- Residents are required to have their contractor provide a certificate of insurance to the Trustees office before any work is started. If you're having work done call the Maintenance Department and check if any of the above applies to your project.

HOPA Survey (Housing for Older People Act)

The HOPA provides housing for older persons and is intended for occupancy by at least one person 55 years of age or older per unit. It requires that periodically information must be collected and verified with the age of all residents. If a survey is not completed, the senior housing community could lose its housing status.

It is mandatory that this survey be completed and filed with the Co-Op office.

Filing of this document is required by Federal Law. Failure to file is an offense.

WHEN IT SNOWS....

No on street or on grass parking is permitted. Move cars to clubhouse parking lot at notice of impending storm. \$50.00 fine and \$60.00 charge if we have to dig out your car.

SNOW REMOVAL SCHEDULE

- Roads will be cleared as soon as 3" of snow has fallen (regardless of the time of day)
- After all roads are passable, the Maint. Dept. will start clearing driveways and sidewalks.
- Duplex driveways will be cleared and should be considered as sidewalks.
- Quads will be cleared by pushing snow forward or to the side, depending on the position of the unit.
- Sidewalks will be cleared as soon as possible, depending on labor availability.
- There will be no deviation from our snow removal program.
- It would be a good idea for each resident to stock their pantry with enough emergency food so that you will not have to venture out in bad weather.
- Keep a bag of Ice Melt on hand for sidewalks and steps.

For those residents who are employed, your employment **will not** entitle you to priority snow clearing. We ask that all residents exercise patience and understanding. You can be an asset to our snow clearing operation by NOT calling the Maint. Dept. to request individual attention. The **ONLY** people who can authorize snow clearing priority are the Trustees.

Special consideration for priority clearing will only be granted for medical appointments and outpatient treatments. You will be required to furnish your doctor's name, phone number and time of appointment. Your appointment and the doctor's availability will be verified before any priority snow clearing is authorized.

Your cooperation will be greatly appreciated.

CRESTWOOD VILLAGE 1 TREE PLANTING INFORMATION

Dear Residents:

You may have noticed K & W Tree Service planting trees throughout Village 1 on or around November 9, 2017. This is the first of two Crestwood Village Co-op Board of Trustees approved tree plantings to supplement the trees removed over the past few years. Twenty-five new trees are currently being planted in open areas around Village 1. It is not intended to be a direct replacement for those trees that were removed.

The types of trees to be planted in November 2017 include:

- 1) Pear Trees
- 2) Two types of Maple Trees
- 3) Two types of Oak Trees

Some of you have received a letter from the Co-op and the Maintenance Department, dated November 3, 2017, indicating a tree would be placed at or near your property.

IT IS IMPERATIVE THAT THE NEW TREES BE WATERED DAILY TO ENSURE THESE NEW TREES SURVIVE

Twenty-five additional trees are approved for a secondary tree planting, currently scheduled for Spring 2018. Letters from the Co-op and Maintenance Department will be delivered to those residents affected by the new plantings at that time. A variety of flowering trees will be selected closer to Spring 2018.

Again, your assistance in keeping the new trees watered and healthy is greatly appreciated.


