This coverage can help protect you if the co-op needs to levy a special assessment due to property damage or other unexpected losses. In the event of a major catastrophe, your insurance company would typically cover the assessment, and you would only be responsible for your policy deductible.

The cost for this coverage is a **few extra dollars per year**, please reach out to your insurance provider to review your policy today.

### MANCHESTER COORDINATING COUNCIL

The MCC monthly meeting was held on Monday, October 28, 2025 at Village 5 Clubhouse, Schoolhouse Rd, Whiting, NJ.

A \$100 check was written out to the Manchester Township Holiday Program. Gift certificates are given to Social Services, who distribute them to families.

Guest speaker was Manchester Township Clerk **Teri Giercyk**. She has many responsibilities as the heart of our County. Election early voting for the election is going on right now. The Mayor wants to spread the word about the **No Knock Program** – applications and stickers are available. Political and religious groups are exempt from this.

Dog licenses are issued from June to June. You can get either a one-year or three-year license. Make sure your dog is up to date on their rabies shots.

Bingo, 50/50, casino nights, raffles, etc., applications are approved at the state level through this office.

This is our **fourth round of Energy Aggregation**. The price is **0.14644 per kilowatt-hour**, which is 5% lower than JCP&L – the first time it's been a cheaper rate than theirs.

**Thanksgiving Meals:** 2,000 meals will be given out. You must sign up with **Judy Noonan** and/or your clubhouse administrator, who will forward your name to Judy. The **Culinary Institute** does a fabulous job with these holiday meals through *Somebody Cares*. JCP&L donated \$10,000 to the food bank.

Regarding the previously discussed **Reserve Budget**, please note your homeowner's insurance policy may have an endorsement rider.

**Councilwoman Sandy Dake** announced there will be a **Veterans Ceremony** at Town Hall on **November 11 at 11:00 a.m.** 

Christmas in the Pines will be held on December 6 at Harry Wright Lake.

**Councilman Jim Vaccaro** reminded everyone that **Daylight Saving Time** ends this Sunday–don't forget to set your clocks back.

**Mayor Hankins** attended a meeting with JCP&L at the County. He stated the Whiting substation is performing very well and will also serve as an emergency substation. Discussions are currently being held with **Aldi** and **CVS** to possibly take over the empty Rite Aid buildings in town.

**Next Month's Guest:** Catherine Cullen from Rutgers Cooperative Extension will be the guest speaker on **November 24, 2025**. She will be discussing "Putting Gardens to Bed," among other topics.

### **MINUTE**

### Holiday Greetings from the Village 1 Maintenance Department!

Total Work Orders Completed (past 30 days) = 279

I apologize if I sound like a broken record, but this month I will go over the snow removal procedures for Village 1 once more. This is a very important topic that everyone needs to be aware of. If you ever need clarification or have any questions regarding the snow removal procedure please contact the Maintenance Department or the Trustees Office. On days of snow removal, the phones at the Maintenance Department will not be answered directly. Please leave a message and someone will return your call at our earliest availability. Snow stakes have been installed, please do not remove or move these stakes as they are positioned to help the plow drivers navigate around potential hazards.

Please see below for Crestwood Village 1's snow clearing guidelines. The information provided below comes directly from the Board of Trustees. The biggest thing we can request is that all residents stay inside when the street and driveway clearing is underway and to please exercise patience and understanding during these times. Special consideration for priority snow removal will only be arranged for medical appointments and outpatient treatments. You are required to provide the Trustee's Office a copy of your doctor's name, phone number and time of your appointment on your respective doctor's letterhead. This must be provided in advance, we will not be able to accommodate calls made the morning of a snow storm. After verifying the information provided, the Board of Trustees and the Trustees Office will prioritize the clearing of these units. The Board of Trustees will not make special arrangements for those that are employed, it will not entitle you to priority snow removal. Please do not call the Maintenance Department to request individual attention, the only ones that can authorize priority snow plowing are the Trustees.

- **1.** Roads will not be plowed until there is around 3" of snow accumulation;
- **2.** When icy conditions are present, ice melt will be applied to the roads:
- **3. NO** on-street parking is allowed for impending snow, you will be assessed a \$50 fine and parking on the grass is not acceptable. If you do leave your vehicle on the grass or road during plowing activities, you will be plowed in. If you require assistance to get your vehicle out, you will be charged a minimum of \$60 for the service and will not be addressed until all other snow clearing activities are completed;
- **4.** Residents are not to push, shovel, blow or deposit snow onto Village roadways;
- **5.** When the roads are made passable, the Maintenance Department will begin to clear driveways, then followed by sidewalks:
- **6.** Duplex driveways will be cleared and treated as sidewalks, as you do have secondary means to exit and enter the building through your garage door;
- **7.** Quad driveways will be cleared by pushing the snow forward towards the buildings or to the side when available, depending on the positioning of your building;
- **8.** Sidewalks will be cleared as soon as possible, depending on the man-power that is available and after roads and driveways are cleared;
- **9.** Keep a bag or two of ice melt on hand for your steps and sidewalk area (available through the Maintenance Department, call for pricing and for delivery). The snow melt provided by the Maintenance Department is not advertised as animal friendly:
- 10. THERE WILL BE NO DEVIATION FROM OUR SNOW REMOVAL PROGRAM.




