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MANCHESTER COORDINATING COUNCIL

The MCC monthly meeting was held at Crestwood Village 5 clubhouse
325 Schoolhouse Rd, Whiting NJ

Melissa DePalma from Senior Services explained the assistance being offered for Manchester seniors. On Tuesday, July 14, from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. at the Crestwood Village 5 clubhouse, Division representatives will be on site to assist residents with filing their 2025 Property Tax Relief Applications.

Yolanda Giovannetti presented an introduction to Artificial Intelligence (AI) and discussed some of its potential dangers. She explained that AI is when computers are designed to think, learn, and solve problems. It is the technology behind many tools we already use, such as voice assistants and smartphone cameras. Examples included Siri and Alexa, Netflix and YouTube recommendations, spam filters that catch junk email, autocorrect, GPS navigation, and Facebook friends and memories.

She also shared tips on staying safe and smart with AI:

- Never share passwords, Social Security numbers, or bank information.
- Stick to trusted apps and websites.
- Double-check information provided by AI.

Judy Noonan announced that she has collected over 1,000 signatures on the Petition in Opposition to Assembly Bill A3466, which she will be submitting this week.

Council members announced their weekly council meeting. The budget was scheduled to be introduced at that meeting, with efforts being made to reduce the financial burden on residents.

The issue of trailers accumulating at the intersection of Route 35 and Schoolhouse Road was raised. The trailers are reportedly located on wetlands. Complaints have been filed, and violations have been issued, but the trailers remain. Code officials are continuing to work on the matter. The trailers are expected to be moved by Tuesday, April 28, 2026.

Traffic concerns were also discussed, including the need for a traffic light at Beckerville Road.

The next meeting will be held on June 22. Mayor Joseph Hankins and Business Administrator Carl Bock will discuss the Master Plan, including what it is and what should be included in it.

Hello Residents of Crestwood Village 1!

Spring has officially sprung and I am seeing lots of residents out and about...taking walks, riding bikes, utilizing our various Village amenities, visiting our dog park and tidying up the yards. This is the time of year for spring cleanups around your units and I have prepared this article to hopefully help residents better understand the dos and don'ts related to some of these cleanup activities. One of the best services Crestwood Village 1 gets that others do not, are weekly brush and bag pickups. Speaking of...

Brush & Bag Procedure

There are several guidelines for you to follow to make this service as efficient as possible. **IF THESE GUIDELINES ARE NOT ADHERED TO, THEN YOUR BRUSH AND/OR BAGS WILL NOT BE PICKED UP.**

Brown paper leaf bags are available in the Maintenance Department at a cost of \$5.00 for a pack of 5 bags.

1. Brush and bags **MUST** be placed curbside Wednesday night or no later than 6:30 AM the morning of Thursday's pickup.
2. Brush must be neatly piled and not blocking access to mailboxes or garbage cans.
3. Bags must be brown paper recyclable lawn and leaf bags. Again, available through the Maintenance Department and any home improvement or most retail stores.
4. **Raking and/or blowing leaves to the curbs is NOT PERMITTED and will not be picked up.** All leaves, pine needles, acorns and pine cones must be collected in the previously mentioned brown paper recyclable lawn and leaf bags.
5. Recycling bags are only for the collection of leaves, pine needles, acorns and pine cones.

6. The workers will leave the bags if there is evidence or improper materials in the bags. Including, but not limited to, sticks, planters, excessive soil, rocks and grass clippings.

7. Tree stumps and root balls are not accepted and will not be picked up.

8. There will be no return trips or doubling back for calls about missed pickups or late callers. If your brush and bag is out by the specified time (#1 above), there should be no issues.

9. Typically there are 2-3 vehicles and 5 workers for the Thursday brush and bag collection. It is highly unlikely that we are missing and piles of brush and/or bags.

10. The recycling bags are collected in one vehicle and another vehicle is towing a chipper and brush is chipped as we make our way.

11. Excessive large piles of brush may not be picked up. If it appears the brush piles were left by a subcontractor, a call will be placed to the resident to discuss. It is pretty obvious when this occurs, especially with our weekly Thursday collection days.

12. These rules are promulgated by Manchester Township and our dumping privileges can be revoked if these guidelines are not adhered to.

As is always the case, if you have any questions or concerns regarding the brush and bag pickup please contact the Maintenance Office. This also applies to any other issues that you may have, we are always here to assist the best we can.
