I have some very important issues to review regarding serious violations,

In the past we sent letters, I'm going to recommend that we skip the letter and fine immediately. If it's a guest the member is responsible for actions. {By-Laws}

MANCHESTER COORDINATING COUNCIL

The MCC monthly meeting was held at Crestwood Village 5 clubhouse on June 22, 2026
325 Schoolhouse Rd, Whiting NJ

Guest speaker Mayor Joseph Hankins was introduced. Mayor Hankins started off by saying he's noticed some things on facebook regarding the community garden, the contract is up with the town, everyone likes the garden, the council agrees with the mayor that it should be and the community benefits from it, it should not be a concern.

Town home overlays are removed, (townhomes allowed on certain blocks of property) only place a problem on east end of town by River Point. The Pineland commission did not approve the ordinance.

Guest speaker Carl Block; Business Administer for Manchester Twp. was introduced to discuss the Master Plan. Manchester is getting into the process starting this fall into the second quarter of next year.

Master Plan: The obligation of the town to meet the states statutory requirements.

Several elements: land use, environmental concern, transportation, traffic, zoning (residential, commercial, industrial etc.).

Karen Argenti, MCC executive member prepared a master plan information document which was handed out. Information included:

What is a master plan: A town's long term guide for growth, development housing, roads, open space and environmental protection.

Why does it matter? Local zoning and land use rules must be based on the master plan.

What does it include? It includes sections on land use, housing, natural resources, roads, public facilities, open space and other community needs.

How does it protect the environment? It helps towns understand natural features and decide where development should or should not happen.

The Manchester Township website assessor section it will take you to a Manchester MAP. There are tabs to click on for overlays on the map to give you: zoning, (what can be built in that zone) wetland areas, pinelands, environmental, flood zone area, county owned property, open space, etc. Carl pointed out that an apartment complex Presidential Gardens that was recently built was approved over 12 years ago, construction started 2 years ago. There is a layer on the map that shows whats approved and not built, proposed but not approved yet. The layer named **ROSI** (Recreation Open Space Inventory) indicates areas that cannot be developed; county and township.

ShopRite is currently in Manchester. They are purchasing the land in Toms River, which was once proposed as a Walmart. ShopRite wants to enlarge their stores.

Trailer's that were parked on the property of Schoolhouse Rd have all been removed. They were there by mistake.

Mayor Hankins announced a McDonalds will be going in where the Rite Aid is on Route 530.

Mayor Hankins stressed the fact that he and his staff are always available to answer questions. Please call town hall and ask your question , do not rely on facebook for your information.

Next meeting scheduled for September 28, 2026.

VILLAGE ONE - - - LEAF & BRUSH PICK UP INSTRUCTIONS



BRUSH AND BAG PROCEDURE

Village One provides removal of brush and bags for our members. Paper bags are available in the maintenance office 732-350-2202 for purchase. There are several guidelines for you to follow to make this as efficient as possible.

- Brush and bags must be out the night before and/or no later that **6:30am** the morning of pickup.
- Raking and/or blowing of leaves to the curb is NOT PERMITTED and will not be picked up by the Village.
- There will be no return and/or doubling back for calls regarding missed pickups or late callers. There are numerous men on the trucks doing the pickups and it is highly unlikely that we are missing any piles or bags.
- Typically, there are 2-3 vehicles making the rounds, one dedicated for brush with the wood chipper in tow and one for bags.
- Brown paper recyclable lawn and leaf bags are the ONLY type of bags permitted to be picked up and used for yard clean up.
- **These bags are for leaves, pine needles, acorns & pine cones only.**
- The workers will leave your bags if there is any evidence of improper materials i.e., sticks, planters, soil, rocks, grass clippings, dog waste, water bottles, gloves etc. The proper intended materials are not heavy and should not make the bags heavy where the workers struggle to get them in the truck.
- **These rules are promulgated by Manchester Township and can revoke our dumping privileges if not strictly adhered to.**
- Brush is to be left in neat piles by the curbside, on the lawn.
- The brush will be picked up and chipped as we make our way through the Village.
- Excessively large piles may not be picked up if it appears that the brush piles were left by a subcontractor. A call will be placed to the member.
- NO tree stumps or root balls of any kind are accepted.

COMMON GROUND

Before You Make Changes to Common Ground PERMISSION REQUEST FORMS REQUIRED

Residents may plant flowers and landscape within **3 feet of the side of their unit** to enhance the appearance of their property.

All areas beyond the 3-foot allowance are considered common ground.

No landscaping, planting, removal of vegetation, or other alterations may be made to common ground without prior written approval from the Board of Trustees and the Maintenance Department.

Any unauthorized changes to common ground may be removed at the Association's discretion, and the area may be restored to its original condition.

Rules & Regulations

11. A small garden a maximum of 8' by 10' or 80 sq. ft. is permitted. Permission requests form must be submitted and authorized by the Trustees. It must be in a location that does not become unsightly to surrounding areas and be 12" away from the building and no higher than the windowsill. The location must first be approved by either a Trustee or a Maintenance Manager.

20. Patios no larger than 12' x 15' or 180 sq. ft. are permitted and must not obstruct natural drainage. They may be screen enclosed with written permission from the Board of Trustees. Three (3) Season rooms are permitted with permission from the Board of Trustees as well as a permit from Manchester Township where applicable. Enclosed patios are not permitted in the front of a building.
